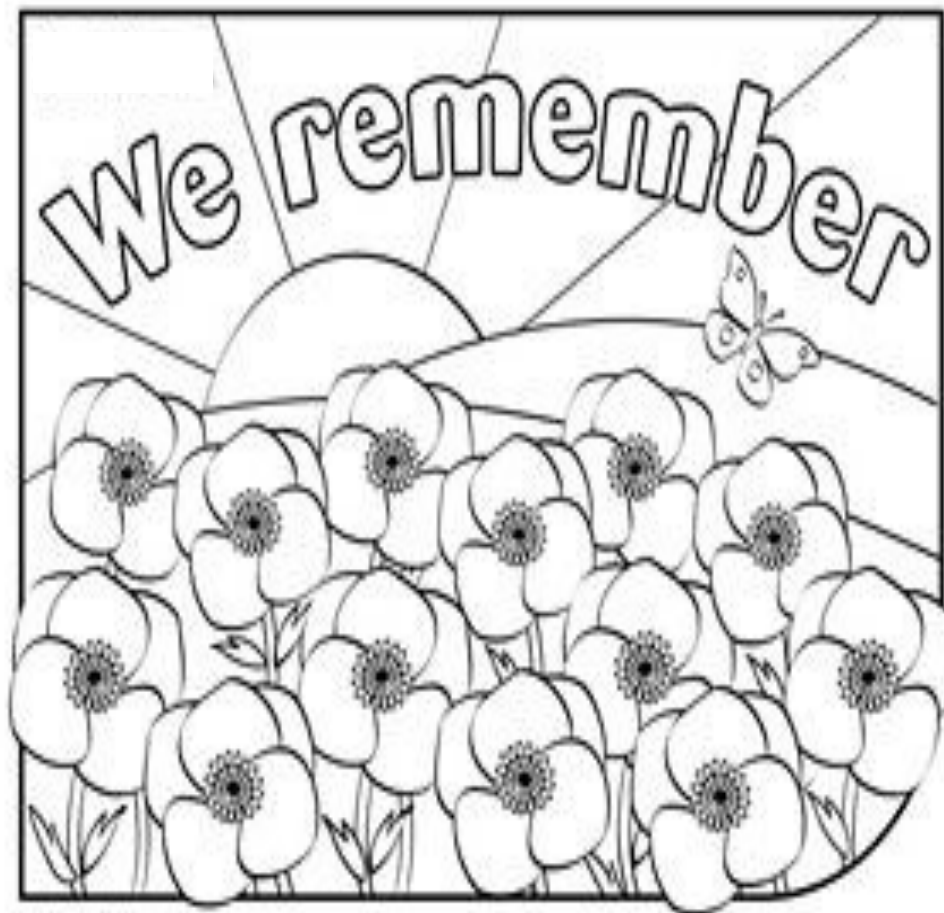

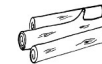

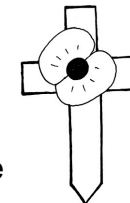


Thinking, remembering...

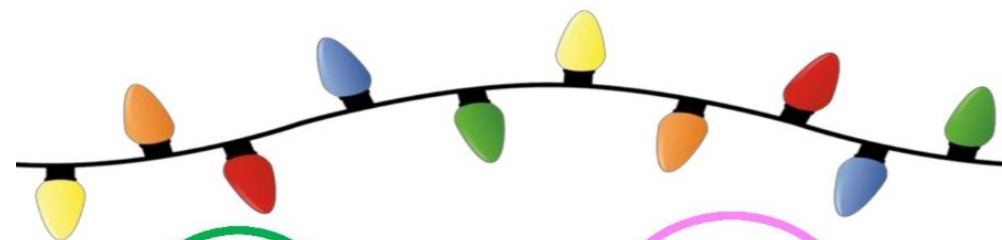

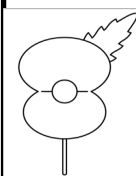


News from the URC

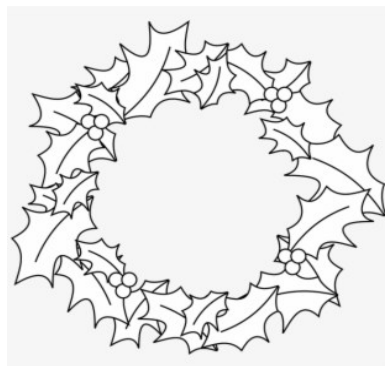


The Open Door Coffee Morning for Macmillan raised over £900!
