Women's Institute

On Thursday 14th November Dyrham and Hinton WI members met for their annual AGM, which provides an opportunity for members to reflect on this year's meetings and variety of activities and talks. Avon



Federation WI representative Lorna Tarr oversaw the formalities of members' votes for nominations of next year's WI committee team. Members expressed their congratulations on the elected 2020 WI committee team and were pleased with the AGM reports. Following on our guest speaker Dr Lucy Grey, inner-city GP, farmer's wife and mother presented a whistle stop tour of women's global health and how women's life expectancy had improved within the modern world from 100 years ago. She explained that women going through the menopause can experience a variety of "many-paws" symptoms and what current medical and natural treatments are available to ease their menopausal symptoms. Lucy touched on improvements in child birth from the last century, mental health issues, domestic violence, and importance of cervical screening, pelvic floor exercises and what local support is available to patients. Lucy highlighted the important of women's bone health and how we can have our cake and eat it in moderation; as ladies with a slightly higher BMI are less likely to sustain bone fractures than those with less bone cushioning. She explained the importance of weight bearing exercises as we grow older as we lose muscle mass and several of her patients stand on one leg whilst boiling the kettle to strength their leg muscles. Lucy's outstanding presentation on women's health and bone health provided an avalanche of questions and received extremely positive feedback from members and non-members present. Future meetings:


