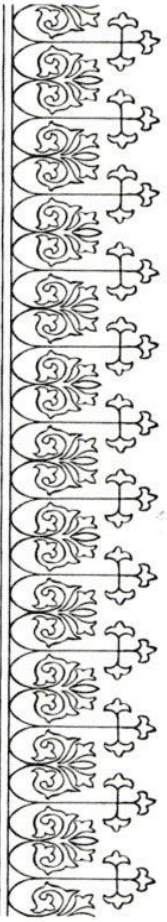

Having had a bit of a think, we have decided that it would perhaps be wiser to delay the start of Open Door until the first Friday in September. See you there!



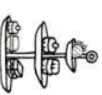
