

A Tribute to the late Margaret Fletcher

There must be a huge number of girls and their families in Wick, Doynton and Dyrham whose lives will have been enriched by having crossed paths with Margaret Fletcher. As both a Brownie and Guide Leader in the Village for many years, she will be immeasurably missed by many. She was an amazing human being who was one of the most kind, caring, clever (but modest) people I have ever come across. Working alongside her with both Brownies and Guides over the years, I saw how she brought out the very best in young people, through gentle encouragement, leading by example and



calm patience beyond measure, getting them to overcome any doubts or reticence and to realise their potential.

Margaret always took the time to seek out those individuals who might need that 'extra' help or support. Not only did she take the time to listen but also to hear what they had to say. She had us all singing, playing (sometimes silly) games, learning new skills and laughing on many occasions during our weekly sessions on Monday evenings as well as the many Camps over the years. She always had a song for every occasion and around the Campfire Margaret was in her element!

Her funeral was held on 10th Sept at St Barnabas Church in Warmley, where she served as Church Warden. The church was filled to the brim with people reflecting the many friendships, the wide range of groups that Margaret belonged to and her wide set of interests and service to others. All of this was outside of her professional career! (of which I later found out about) Margaret was so very modest, despite being a Professor at UWE and producing many research papers on Children's Diseases and Vaccines.

Margaret passed away at home on 20th August following a shockingly short and unbelievably cruel illness. On behalf of the people of this Parish, I offer my sincere condolences to Nicola and all of Margaret's family. She really was a 'Guiding Light' in every sense of the word and I feel blessed to have had her as one of my friends.
