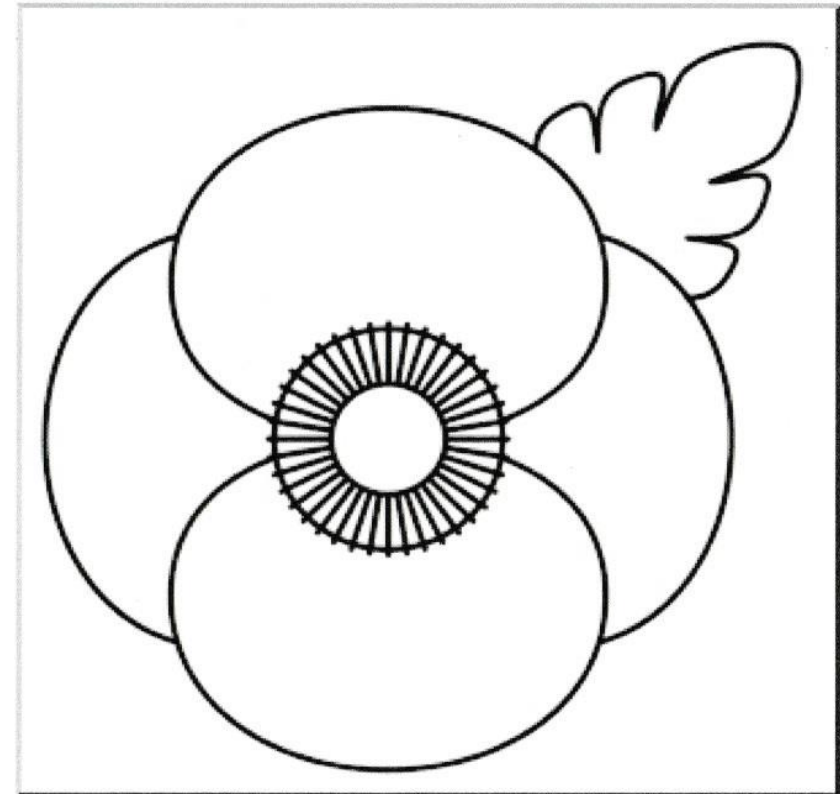

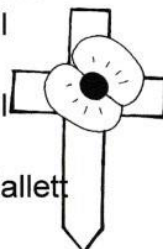

Keep yourself and others safe this autumn and winter

As autumn arrives, many of us will be thinking about the colder months and what we can do to keep ourselves healthy. Colds, flu and other respiratory illnesses are more common in colder months as people are indoors more often, allowing viruses to pass more easily from one person to another. This will also mean the risk of Covid-19 infection is higher. These infections, as well as cold weather can make some health problems worse and even lead to serious complications, especially if you are 65 or older, or if you have a long-term health condition.

Director of Public Health for South Gloucestershire, Sara Blackmore and Leader of South Gloucestershire Council, Toby Savage are therefore urging everyone in South Gloucestershire to take sensible and safe precautions to keep themselves and others safe.

Their advice is to:

- Come forward when invited for vaccination of both Covid and flu
- Cover your nose and mouth when you cough and sneeze
- Stay at home if you are unwell, to reduce the risk of passing any illnesses on to friends, family, colleagues, and others in your community
- Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day
- Wear a face covering in enclosed and crowded spaces where you come into contact with people you don't normally meet or where it will make you and others feel more comfortable
- Take a regular rapid Covid-19 test twice a week if you don't have symptoms.

- Try to meet outdoors or in well-ventilated indoor areas
- Self-isolate and get a PCR test if you have symptoms of Covid-19
- Self-isolate if you test positive for Covid-19 or are told to do so by NHS Test and Trace. This remains a legal requirement

Be kind, courteous and considerate of others – take into account not only your own risks, but also of those around you, such as those with clinical vulnerabilities. More information about how to stay well this winter is available here [How to stay well in winter - NHS](#) (www.nhs.uk)

Booster vaccine

People aged 50 years and over, care home residents, health and social care workers and younger people at risk (who have already had 2 doses of the Covid-19 vaccine) are being prioritised to receive a booster jab from 6 months after their second dose. This move will prolong the protection vaccines offer, particularly for those most vulnerable to Covid-19 as we head into the autumn and winter months.

1st Team Match Report: Wick 8 – 1 English Bicknor – Sat 2nd Oct @ Oldbury Lane, Wick

Wick showed no mercy to today's visitors English Bicknor finding the back of their net eight times and only conceding one in reply. On a rain-soaked afternoon, both teams came out to play football on what was an immaculate prepared pitch. Wick were rampant from the start and missed some early chances, but their first clear opening came after 9 mins when a well struck Mike Hardiman shot hit the Bicknor crossbar. Although restricted to the odd break,

Bicknor did open up the Wick defence on 22 mins, but Wick's Keeper, Ash Wintle made a great block to deny Bicknor's striker, Blaine Smith. Wick continued to create chances, but were wasteful in front of goal and not testing Bicknor's keeper Craig Edwards.

The opening goal for Wick came on the 36th minute Mike Hardiman stroking the ball home following a Jordan Yeo corner. Wick continued to dominate the remaining part of the 1st half, and could have doubled their lead but Rob Moore blasted over from inside the 18 yard box. HT: Wick 1 – 0 Bicknor.

A minute into the second half the Wick doubled their lead Rob Moore slotting home after Bicknor keeper Edwards spilled Harris's shot. Wick were starting to apply even more pressure and 4 minutes later Luke Lecrass then made it 3-0 from another Jordan Yeo corner. With the Bicknor goal in peril and Wick's forward line in control, on 57 minutes Ben Harris's shot beat Edwards to make it 4-0.

It became 5-0 in the 62nd minute when Rob Moore headed his second from a Jordan Yeo cross. English Bicknor did eventually get on the score sheet on 65 minutes when an innocuous cross from Liam Davies evaded everyone and ended up in the back of the Wick net.

Mike Hardiman netted his second to make it 6-1 after 71 minutes. Then Joe Thomas came off the bench and should have scored with almost his first touch but Edwards saved. Thomas did however make up for that miss in the 77th minute when he drifted into the box to hit his shot into the far corner after a through ball from Mike Hardiman. Hardiman completed his hat-trick in the 78th minute with a crisp shot from just inside the box after good work from 17 year old Henry Sady.

This was the final goal, but Wick continued upto the final whistle with relentless pressure on the Bicknor's goal, but Edwards was not to be beaten again and made three further saves to ensure the scoreline didn't reach double figures. A great around performance from Wick with the full time score ending 8-1.

COP26 - What's that, then?

In 1986 HRH Prince Philip, then International President of the World Wildlife Fund, invited five leaders of five of the major religions of the world - Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam and Judaism - to meet to discuss how their faiths could help save the natural world. From this meeting the religious leaders found that "each of our religions is as fearful and concerned about the future of this fragile planet.....". That was 1986 and up to today we are still talking about climate change and its impact on everyone on this planet- everyone.

Social research is finding that our children are worried and stressed about their future lives because of climate change. I think we have to acknowledge this and take it seriously.

Right now there is a major meeting here in the UK. COP26- have you heard of it? COP26 is the 2021 United Nations climate change conference . For nearly three decades the UN has been bringing together almost every country on earth for global climate summits – called COPs – which stands for 'Conference of the Parties'.

This 26th time world leaders will meet in Glasgow. The risk is that it will be more talk and not enough action. But I pray, as will the world's religions be praying for a difference. Can you join that hope and prayer? In the Bible is a verse from the book of Psalms ch24 vs 1. The earth is the Lord's and everything in it". Meaning that God is the creator and owner of this wonderful planet, and our role is to be good stewards taking care of the earth and all animals, all plant life and people, while using its resources wisely for all to live equally, with justice.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if we can all participate in that ? For our sake, for our children's sake and for their children too. And of course to honour our creator God - this is something all those religious leaders in 1986 hoped for.

We each have a part to play and I expect many of you are doing your part, so let's keep acting and encouraging our government and world leaders to do more action than talk.

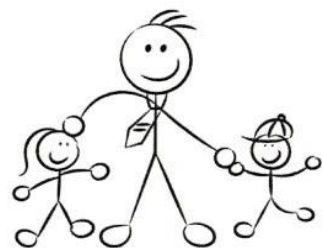
