Optimism

Luke 21:29-30

Then He told them a parable: "Behold the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they put forth leaves, you see it and know for yourselves that summer is now near."



It may not feel like it, but Spring IS on the way, with all its promise of new life and new possibilities. Hard to imagine, with the weather forecast predicting "milder temperatures" of 10 degrees! But if you look around with a keen eye, you will spot the signs: snowdrops flowering, green shoots poking through the chilly earth. The gardeners amongst us will be looking for the signs of the bulbs we planted last autumn, the birds will be singing louder and earlier and every day the daylight starts a little earlier, and ends a little later. We know this, with a certainty born of experience. It is not a matter of faith, or hope, but absolute conviction. The world will turn towards the sun, as it always has and always will.

On the other hand, it is impossible to be unaware that other things do need a lot more faith, or hope; the end to the Covid-19 pandemic seems a long way off, for example. There are unsettling rumours of political unrest elsewhere in the world. Climate change still seems inevitable. But we really aren't: ordinary people like us are the scientists and medical staff, beavering away finding effective treatments and planning how to cope; world governments, made up of people who get up in the morning and put their trousers on one leg at a time, just like us, are working hard to ensure that peace prevails; and the move to protect the planet and repair it is gathering pace. We can all play our part, no matter how small. Wear a mask, pick up some litter, write to your MP, contribute somehow.

Where is God in all this? He is in that snowdrop and the birdsong, He is in the minds of the scientist who thinks, "I wonder if...?", He is strengthening the arm of the person who challenges a litter lout, He is the hand that comforts a patient who is scared of dying. You can see God everywhere, if you know how to look.

A research team at the University of Cambridge is to lead a groundbreaking study exploring genomics in gastrointestinal stromal tumours (GISTs), with the aim of unlocking new treatment options for these cancer patients. The study is co-funded by the charity **GIST Cancer UK**, whose Vice-Chair is Doynton resident Jayne Bressington. Jayne and her husband Kim lost their daughter Eve to the childhood form of the cancer, known as PAWS-GIST, in 2018.

News from the Chapel:

A huge thank you to the 80 plus friends who came to our Christmas Sale, the day of the power cut. In spite of not being able to warm up with a hot cuppa and refreshments, the mood was cheerful and we managed to make £640.

It was warmer on the evening of our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service and we enjoyed the usual carols, poems, readings and a solo from Rob.

Our first service of the year saw us looking forward to a new future for our chapel and reflecting on where we are and who we are in these uncertain times. One of the questions we are asking ourselves is, how can we be a meaningful presence and blessing to our local community? We are possibly the least likely group of people to do something radical, yet we are open to the possibility.

We remembered the words of a well-known poem by Bristol born Minnie Haskins:

"I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year, give me a light that I may tread safely in to the unknown. And he replied, 'Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way.'"

We also remembered Archbishop Desmond Tutu, whose funeral had just been held and we shared a few of his better-known sayings which chimed with themes that we have been exploring. He observed that we are all connected and that what unites us is our common humanity. "You can't exist as a human being in isolation. You can't be human all by yourself."

He also said: "Do your little bit of good where you are; it's those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world." That seems like good advice in these Covid times.



Our second service of the month starts with breakfast and this month Elizabeth shared some thoughts about the differences between the nativity story as told by Luke and the story as told by Matthew. It led to an interesting, informal and sometimes controversial, but always good-humoured discussion around our breakfast

Our third Sunday service is a sharing service and the theme this month was: how has your faith changed over the years?

Several members recalled how they were made to go to Sunday school as children, but they also appreciated the lessons they were taught about honesty, integrity and, above all, about treating others as we would wish to be treated ourselves. These lessons are not exclusive to Christianity, but in times past they were very much emphasised in our local Sunday schools.

We finished with a story, told by Dave Tomlinson in his book "Black Sheep and Prodigals". The story tells of two men walking along a beach, discussing life, the universe and everything. They came across a young child who was wholly engaged in the task of pouring water from the sea into a hole in the sand. When they asked what he was doing, the child replied earnestly that he was emptying the sea into the hole. As the two men continued their discussion, they concluded that they were trying to do a similar thing. "It's just as impossible to understand the mystery of God as it is for the boy to put the sea into the hole in the sand. Our minds are just tiny thimbles, while the reality of God is as vast as the ocean."

2022 marks 50 years of the United Reformed Church and our Chapel will be 185 years old. We aim to mark it with a Flower Festival in the Summer – more details next month.

Match report: Wick 1 – 1 Little Stoke – Sat 18th Dec

Wick remained unchanged from last week's fixture against Gala Wilton, with Rob Moore captaining the side from George Hale, Luke Lecrass, Kyle Curtis, Sam Thomas, James Pocock, Joe Thomas, Ben Harris, Nathan Gore, Mike Hardiman, Todd Carter. Subs included Tommy Longhurst, Ben Weaver, Russ Woodford and Joe Pople. Wick's current season statistics were looking fantastic, remaining undefeated at the nest, playing 19 games overall, winning 14, drawing 3 and only losing 2 games. With Shirehampton without a game, it was important for Wick to get something out of the game in order to try and close the gap on the leaders, but they knew it was always going to be a tough fixture against a strong, resilient Little Stoke team. Wick started the final fixture of 2021 in impressive form, playing with real dominance over Little Stoke in the opening minutes. Mike Hardiman and Nathan Gore were combining well in the middle of the park, and 20 minutes in a shot from Wick's number nine Todd Carter failed to trouble Little Stoke's keeper Jakob Glover. Wick's second attempt of the game came after 30 minutes when Ben Harris's mazy run failed to break the deadlock as he fired wide of the goal. A few minutes later Wick did manage to open the scoring following a Little Stoke corner, Wick broke away and Luke Lecrass and Joe Thomas interchanged passes before Lecrass neatly chipped the ball over Glover into an empty net to put Wick 1-0 up. Glover was called into action again on the forty two minute mark, saving Ben Harris's well struck freekick low to the far post after Kyle Curtis was brought down by a Little Stoke defender. Wick should have increased their lead in free half injury time, but Todd Carters headed wide after Glover had punched away a Ben Harris corner

After an even start to the second half, Wick came close to increasing their lead on sixty minutes when after a fine six pass move Rob Moore headed wide of the upright from a Joe Thomas cross. One minute later Ben Harris was again causing problems for the Little Stoke defence, but he failed to hit the target. On sixty five minutes, Wick made their first substitution with Ben Weaver replacing Todd Carter. Minutes later it was the turn of Nathan Gore to challenge the Little Stoke goal, but his fierce drive was clawed away by Glover. On seventy five minutes, Tommy Longhurst replaced Ben Harris. Wick continued to pepper the Little Stoke goal, but Alex Hill and Tim O'Loughlin stood firm at the heart of the Little Stoke defence. On eighty five minutes, Wick's

keeper George Hale was brought into action saving well from an Aaron West shot, however, Hale sustained a rib injury in the process and was replaced by Joe Pople. With the game looking like a 1-0 win for Wick, Jazz Bright headed home following a well taken Jack Burgess's corner deep in time added on. Wick were bitterly disappointed, after controlling a large percentage of the game.

What kind of people are we looking for?

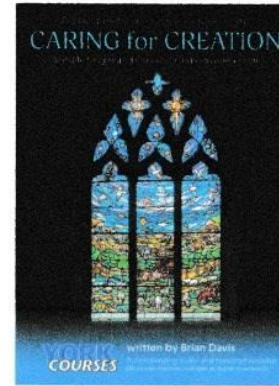
