



News from 60 Years Ago:

Two issues of the Dyrham & Hinton Chronicle were published in May 1962. Cuckoos, a species now sadly missing from our parish, feature prominently in the 7th May edition, with many being seen (and heard) over the Easter weekend. Mrs Edwards at the shop reportedly had this to say on the subject: 'From a distance the cuckoo's song sounds mellow but from near to it is raucous.' In more serious news, Good Friday witnessed an accident on Bride Hill with the ice-cream man narrowly avoiding colliding with a cantering horse. Elaine and Thelma Thornell witnessed the incident and reported that the ice-cream van tipped over, throwing all the ice-cream out onto the road: 'When the accident happened the ice-cream man had just loaded up and he hadn't even sold one cornet.'

The 21st May edition of the Chronicle included an appeal for old spectacles, broken or not, with readers being urged to pass them on to Mrs Vincent: 'They will be sent to Africa where qualified opticians will recondition them for the leper colonies.' In more exciting news, the Squire had recently hosted a motor racing event at Dyrham Park, featuring over seventy sports cars. Young reporter Douglas Densley reported the following: 'It was exciting, especially when one of the cars went off the track.' Perhaps the pick of the crop though is this news item from young reporter Clifford Toghill: 'The new road is called the M4. It will run only four fields from my house. There is to be a fly-over at Doddington. Peter Lawson says that the sheds in Little Grove have to come down. The holes they are digging are nearly as deep as I am tall.'



Finally, apologies, please note the change to one of our inset days next academic year - now Friday 25th November and not Friday 2nd December.






