My Memories of the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in June 1953

In celebration of the Jubilee, local resident George Alway has kindly shared his memories of the coronation: All of us children from Dyrham School between the ages of 5 – 15 years were presented with a decorated coronation mug and a Bible in a presentation case which I still have. We were also given a shining newly minted crown coin worth 5 shillings at the time. On Coronation Day we were invited to Dyrham house in the morning to receive these gifts from Squire Blathwayt and it poured with rain as we walked there so we were very wet. In the afternoon it was sunny, and we had various activities and games in Farmer Pullin's field followed by a tea party in the Village Hall which we really enjoyed. A few weeks later we went to London in Mr Andrews from Marshfield's Charabanc to see the illuminations, which we thought were brilliant as we didn't even have electric lights. The charabanc was over booked and most of the small children had to sit on boxes or a chair in the gangway. We enjoyed plenty of sandwiches and pop when we stopped. The adults had beer and cider. On arriving in London, we went to a news cinema showing the Coronation in Technicolour which we thought was fantastic. We got back home in the early hours of the morning after a very memorable day which I have never forgotten.

What a season! For those who haven't followed the fortunes of the football club, the first team are champions of the Marcliff Gloucestershire County League. Our reserves have turned a real corner after Christmas and if had started so well would have been amongst the front runners in the league for promotion. Our Over 45's have won their league campaign and play in the league cup final at Wick on Sunday 22nd May, KO 10am. The club would like to thank their managers and committee members for all their hard work, they include Joe Pople, Chris Simsek, Ian Bright, Paul Bond, Dave Crew, John Gaylard, Kev Pollard, Trevor Hardiman, Gary Reilly, Nick Marsh, Mark Faithfull, Jeff Britton, Neil Longhurst, Dave Beer, John Towler, Tom Allen, Jordan Scott, Shaun Morris and James Pocock. Wick has had a village football team since at least the early 1930's when Wick Athletic competed in the Bristol District league div 3, however we have no earlier records. So if anyone has any more historical information please let us know, and we would be happy to include them into our club history record.

Wick Athletic merged with Wick CA in around 1974, and since then we have been a single club with multiple sides.

Today's teams represent nearly 100 years of football in Wick, and this is its best ever achievement. It is great to see so many villagers turn up on matchdays to watch, and we hope that they have enjoyed the experience and our welcoming clubhouse. Wick FC are the best supported team in the Gloucestershire County League and we receive great feedback from visitors with regard to the facilities at Oldbury Lane.

Like many organisations run by volunteers, we are always on the lookout for additional help. So if you can spare a few hours on matchdays to help out then please let us know and you will be welcomed into a vibrant team.

The success of the club has allowed it to be promoted however this requires ground and safety improvements. Plans have been submitted to South Glos by the Sports Ground which we hope will be passed soon. 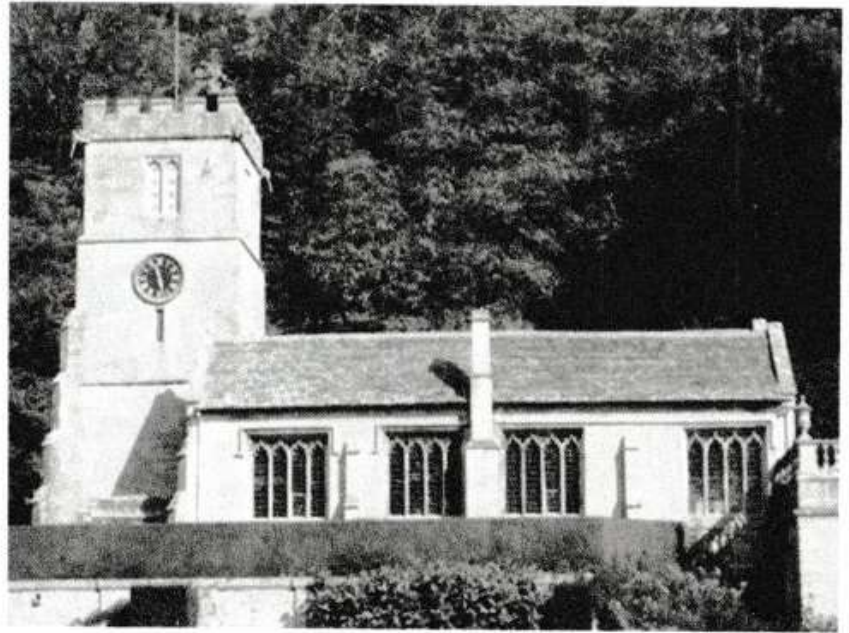

Time takes its toll, and we need to do some major repair work, mainly to the tower roof.

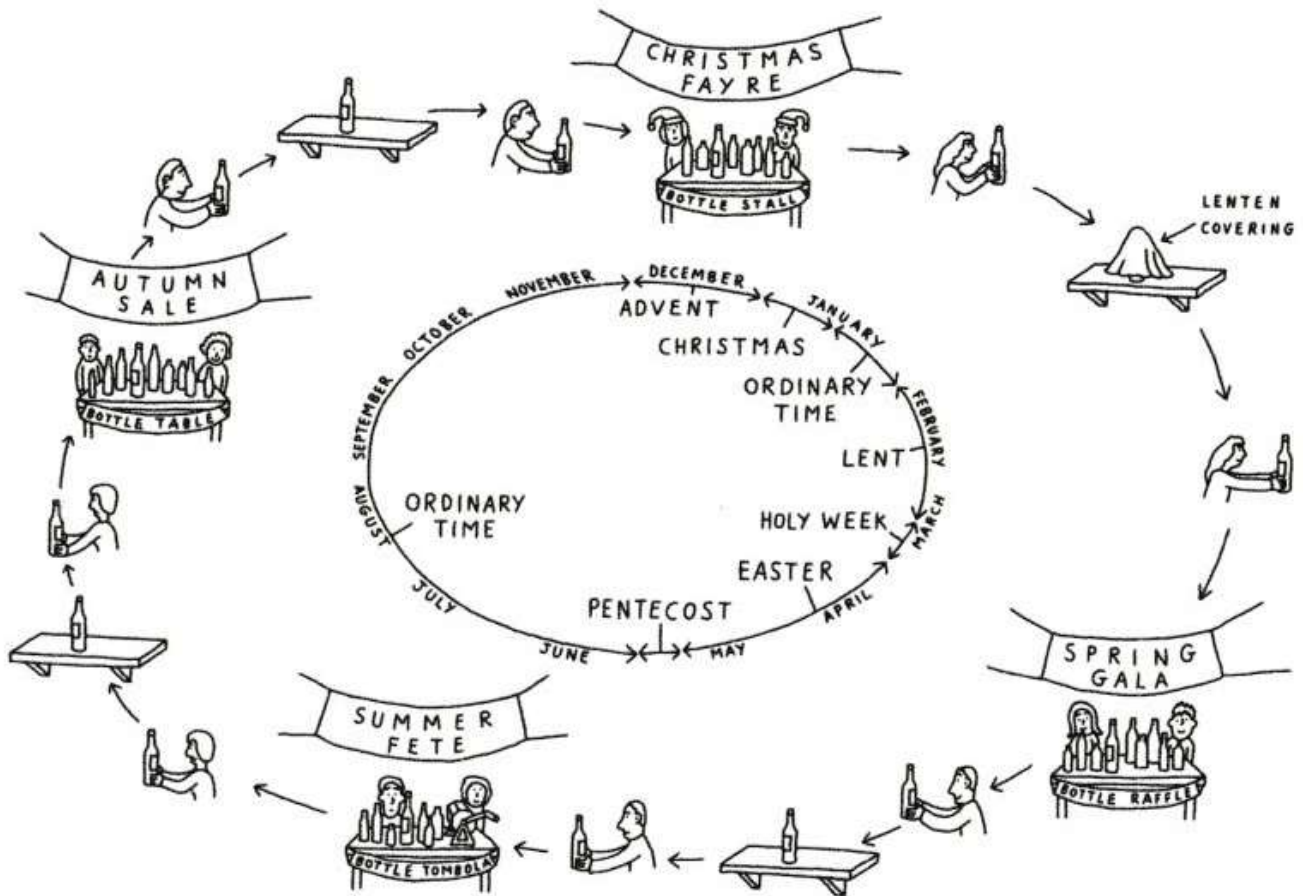
