# Almondsbury

Over Lane/Sundays Hill, Lower Almondsbury, BS32 4BL

Grid reference **ST 60145 83673** 

This is a war memorial in the form of a stone crucifix on the junction of Over Lane and Sundays Hill (opposite the entrance to Almondsbury Garden Centre).





### **Alveston**

St Helen's Church, Greenhill, Alveston, BS35 2QX

Grid reference **ST 63390 87489** 

A stone Celtic cross located in the grounds of St Helen's Church.





### **Aust**

#### St John's Church, Main Road, Aust, BS35 4AZ

Grid reference **ST 57240 89078** 

A combined service of remembrance is held in the church at Olveston on Remembrance Sunday, recalling the names of all the fallen from Olveston, Aust, Elberton, and Littleton-on-Severn.

### **Badminton**

#### Village Hall, Hayes Lane, Badminton, GL9 1DD

Grid Reference **ST 80455 82730** 

Village hall erected in memoriam of WWI & WWII. On the wall opposite the stage there are plaques with the names of the fallen.





### **Bitton**

#### St Mary's Church, Church Road, Bitton, BS30 6LJ

Grid Reference **ST 69272 69902** 

A war memorial in the form of a stone celtic cross on a stepped base.

A memorial shelter.

### Charfield

#### Wotton Road, Charfield, GL12 8QB

Grid Reference **ST 71987 92165** 

This is a war memorial in the form of a celtic cross.





# Chipping Sodbury

Town Cross, Broad Street/ Horse Street, Chipping Sodbury, BS37 6DA Grid Reference ST 72921 82235

This memorial dates from 1919 and incorporates a structure dating from the late 14th century. The remains of a mediaeval cross-shaft and base were incorporated in the memorial erected shortly after WWI. The base is hexagonal with four steps and dates from the 20th century. This is surmounted by a plinth and the mediaeval cross-shaft and base. The memorial is topped with a cross also dating from the 20th century. The memorial is inscribed with the names of those who fell in WWI and WWII.





### Chipping Sodbury School, Bowling Road, Chipping Sodbury, BS37 6EW *Grid Reference ST* 72720 81783

This small plaque is mounted on the wall within the school building. It lists the names of pupils who attended the school and who gave their lives during WWI and WWII.





# Coalpit Heath

St. Saviour's Church, Badminton Road, Coalpit Heath, BS36 2LW *Grid Reference* ST 87354 80723

A stone memorial cross sited within the churchyard.





### Cold Ashton

Holy Trinity Church, Hydes Lane, Cold Ashton, SN14 8JU Grid Reference ST 75097 72722

This is a memorial in the form of a celtic cross and is sited within the churchyard. It commemorates both WWI and WWII.







### Cromhall


#### St. Andrew's Church, Church Lane, Cromhall, GL12 8AL

Grid Reference **89251 90461** 

This is a war memorial in the form of a stone Celtic cross and it is sited within the churchyard. George to doctor picture.







### Downend

#### Badminton Road/Westerleigh Road, Downend, BS16 6BQ

Grid reference **ST 65162 76740** 

Located at the junction of Badminton Road and Westerleigh Road, this memorial was erected in the memory of Rev. Philip George Alexander and the members of the 1st Downend Scout Troop, who lost their lives in WWI. It was refurbished in 2005.



Rev. Alexander was a chaplain in the Royal Navy and was the founder of the 1st Downend Scout Troop. He was lost when the 'Hampshire' was sunk in WWI. The parish council agreed to have the war memorial refurbished during 2005 as part of a regeneration programme of works within the Downend area. An annual service of remembrance is held at the memorial.

# Doynton

#### Holy Trinity Church, Church Road, Doynton

Grid Reference **ST 72055 74090** 

The memorial is located within the grounds of Holy Trinity Church.





# Dyrham

St. Peter's Church, Upper Street, Dyrham, SN14 8ER

Grid reference **ST 74125 75806** 

This war memorial is located within the grounds of St Peter's Church.





# Elberton (Aust)

#### St John's Church, Elberton

Grid Reference **ST 57240 89079** 

These war memorial plagues are mounted on the wall of St John's Church.

### **Falfield**

Bristol Road, Falfield, GL12 8DW (by the corner of the A38 and Sunday's Hill) *Grid reference ST 68310 93256* 

This war memorial was erected in 1921 to commemorate local men who had lost their lives in WWI. Its original site was in a triangle at the junction of Sundays Hill Lane and the A38. In the early 1960s it was moved to its present position, outside the church wall on the A38.





### Filton

#### St Peter's Church, Church Road, Filton

Grid reference **ST 60315 79170** 

This memorial is located within the grounds of St Peter's Church. Inside the church there are two further memorials significant to Filton. One names victims of the daylight raid on the aircraft factory in September 1940 and the other is a memorial to all employees of the aircraft works who lost their lives in WWI and WWII.





### Filton Library, The Shield Retail Centre, Link Road, Filton, BS34 7BR *Grid Reference ST* 60250 79052

This memorial is a plaque located on the outside wall of Filton Library in the Shield Centre.

These plaques are mounted within Filton Community Centre.

# Frampton Cotterell

### St. Peter's Church, Church Road Frampton Cotterell, BS36 2AB Grid reference ST 66732 81980

This memorial was erected by public subscription in 1922. It is in the form of a 14ft high Celtic cross of Portland stone. The plinth is inscribed with the names of 21 servicemen killed during WWI and 2 servicemen who died during WWII. In 2005 the parish council refurbished this memorial and inserted a new panel of Portland stone with the WWI names inscribed afresh.





### Zion Church, Woodend Road, Frampton Cotterell *Grid Reference* 67182 81285

A brass panel is affixed to the west wall. It is inscribed with the names of 10 servicemen who died during WWI, whose families worshipped at the church. These names also appear on the war memorials at St. Peter's and St. Saviour's.



### Hallen

#### Hallen Road, Hallen, BS10 7RP

Grid reference **ST 55088 79970** 

A war memorial has been noted at this location but no further information is available at this time.





### Hambrook

#### Whiteshill Common, Whiteshill, Hambrook, BS16 1SD

Grid reference **ST 64524 79314** 

This war memorial is of pennant stone in the form of a massive, slightly tapered rectangular Celtic cross. The memorial is plain except for the 'line of life' traced on the face of the head. It commemorates both WWI and WWII.





### Hanham

Memorial Garden, Hanham Folk Centre, High Street, Hanham, BS15 3EJ Grid reference ST 64333 72258

This war memorial is located inside the grounds of the memorial garden at the front of Hanham Folk Centre. There is also a plaque mounted on the wall.







# Hawkesbury Upton

High Street/ Park Street, Hawkesbury Upton GL9 1AT

Grid reference **ST 77995 86939** 

A war memorial in the form of a stone cross on the junction of High Street and Park Street, erected in 1920 and unveiled on 8 August of that year. It was dedicated to those parishioners who fell in WWI. At some point after the end of WWII the names of parishioners who fell in that war were added, and a surrounding wall was built with a gated entrance.





### Hill

#### St. Michael's Church, Hill Road, Hill, GL13 9EB

Grid Reference **ST 64939 95225** 

This memorial tablet is located in the church porch. It commemorates those who lost their lives during WWI.



### Horton

St. James the Elder Church, Upper Chalkley Lane, Horton, BS37 6QR Grid reference ST 76598 85042

Two war memorial plaques are mounted on the wall in the village church adjacent to Horton Court.



### Iron Acton

St. James the Lesser Church, High Street, Iron Acton, BS37 9UG Grid reference ST 68067 83450

A war memorial plaque is mounted on the wall within the village church.



# Kingswood

Holy Trinity Church, High Street, Kingswood, BS15 4AB Grid reference ST 65078 73798

A war memorial was recorded at Kingswood Park in 1984. By 2002 it had been moved to the adjacent churchyard. It is surrounded by three wall mounted plaques.





# Littleton-Upon-Severn

St Mary's Church, Stock Hill, Littleton Upon Severn, Littleton-Upon-Severn, BS35 1NL

Grid reference **ST 60067 90225** 

There is a memorial plaque in the village church. There are two Rolls of Honour lists mounted on wall nearby.

A combined service of remembrance is held in the church at Olveston on Remembrance Sunday, recalling the names of all the fallen from Olveston, Aust, Elberton, and Littleton-on-Severn.





# Mangotsfield

St. James's Place, Mangotsfield, BS16 9JA

Grid reference **ST 66409 76049** 

This is a war memorial in the form of a stone cross with a stepped base and a surrounding shrub bed.





### Marshfield

#### High Street, Marshfield, SN14 8LP

Grid reference **ST 78083 73714** 

The Memorial is a marble obelisk set on a square base surrounded by 4 marble planters. It is located in the Market Place at the East end of the main street in the village. The memorial was refurbished in 1993.





#### St Marys Church, Church Lane, Marshfield, SN14 8NT

Grid reference **ST 78210 73675** 

Within the church there are two memorial plaques. One commemorates WWI and the other WWII





# Oldbury-on-Severn

#### Memorial Hall, Camp Road, Oldbury-on-Severn, BS35 1PR

Grid reference **ST 60935 92694** 

The original hall was built between 1924 and 1926 and was largely funded by donations from returning servicemen out of their demobilisation payment. Its purpose was for social gatherings and games etc. Ex-servicemen had free entry. There is an engraved tablet reading 'Lest we Forget' on the outside gable end. The gates repeat these words, and indicate the dates of both WWI and WWII. The original structure has been increased in size in three phases and the unit now operates as a self-supporting village hall.





### St. Arilda's Church, Church Road, Oldbury-on-Severn, BS35 1QG Grid reference ST 60834 91905

Within the church there are two memorial tablets bearing the names of those who lost their lives. The first is of engraved brass and it lists a large number of names of those who fell during WWI. Records indicate that this tablet was erected by the Oldbury-on-Severn War Memorial Hall charity. The second tablet relates to WWII and it is believed to have been erected by the parish.





# Old Sodbury

### St John The Baptist Church, Church Lane, Old Sodbury, BS37 6NB Grid reference ST 75605 81771 Grid reference ST 75561 81805

The memorial is in the form of a lych gate at the entrance to the churchyard erected in 1920 to commemorate 16 men who lost their lives in World War I, including 2 peers. The names are inscribed on the roof beams over the gate. After WWII it was amended to include the 6 who were killed during World War II. More recently another name has been added. There is also a memorial plaque within the church itself.







#### Olveston

St. Mary the Virgin Church, The Street/Church Hill, Olveston, BS35 4DR Grid reference ST 60105 87268

This war memorial is located in the south-east corner of the churchyard, erected to the memory of 33 local men who fell in WWI. It was unveiled and dedicated on Sunday 1st August 1920 by Dr Wynne Willson, the Dean of Bristol and chief patron of the living of Olveston. On the day of the service the church was crowded, with many more stood outside. The front seats were reserved for the relatives of the fallen men. About 100 ex-servicemen under Major C.E. Turner, D.S.O. paraded and attended the service, prior to which the ringers rang a muffled peel.

The organising committee, chaired by the local vicar, collected £500 to cover the cost of the cross and its installation. The cross was designed by Sir Reginald Bloomfield, R.A. and is a replica of one designed for the battlefield cemeteries. The architect, Mr Graham Awdry of Bristol, created a setting by modifying the churchyard wall and placing a series of steps of local stone to lead up to the cross from the roadway. The height of the cross from its base is fourteen-and-a-half feet and features a bronze crusader's sword on either side. The installation of the memorial was carried out by Mr Cullen of Olveston. In 1946 a further bronze plate was added with the names of local men who fell in WWII. In 1953 a further plate was added for the Korean War.

A combined service of remembrance is held in the church on Remembrance Sunday, recalling the names of all the fallen from Olveston, plus those who are remembered on plaques within the churches at Aust, Elberton, and Littleton-on-Severn.







# Patchway

The Royal British Legion HQ, Rodway Road, Patchway, BS34 5PE *Grid reference ST* 60007 81526

This white marble memorial is located in the forecourt of the Royal British Legion HQ in Patchway. No names are inscribed on the memorial itself. These are held inside the British Legion building in a book of remembrance.

The town council and the Royal British Legion plan to erect a more substantial memorial in a prominent position when the Northfield development takes place on Filton Airfield in the next few years.



# Pilning

#### Cross Hands Road/ Northwick Road, Pilning, BS35 4JB

Grid reference **ST 55554 85152** 

This war memorial is located at the junction of Northwick Road and Cross Hands Road. It contains the names of those who fell in WWI and WWII.

In March 1943, following a bombing raid that resulted in damage at the Cross Hands junction, the parish council sought help from Gloucestershire County Council for general repairs, a road widening scheme and refurbishment of the memorial. In October 1944 the memorial was damaged by a US Army lorry backing out of the Cross Hands Inn opposite, during the blackout. The cost of repairs was estimated at £95 and in June 1946 the US Army paid this sum in compensation. This money was used for renewing the original lettering, adding the WWII names and making arrangements to move the memorial from the Cross Hands junction due to increasing traffic and concerns over further damage.

In December 1979 a poll was carried out to decide whether to move the memorial back to the original Cross Hands site. Of the 53% of the parish that voted 585 voted for the proposal, 324 against, and 89 were undecided. Due to the costs involved the parish council did not act on this. During 1993 a further poll involving a mere 10% of the residents resulted in a small margin in favour of returning the memorial to its original site. This time however, the movement was led by more active participants.

In 1994 the increasing number of participants in the remembrance service and the resultant lack of space in the cemetery led to the parish council mounting an initiative to move the memorial to celebrate their centenary. The move, costing around £3000, was partially funded by ICI and Zeneca, and South Gloucestershire Council was involved in providing and paying for structural work designed to protect the memorial.





### Pucklechurch

Memorial Gates, St. Thomas A Becketts Church, Westerleigh Road, Pucklechurch, BS16 9RB

Grid reference **ST 69894 76512** 

These gates are located at the entrance to the path leading to St Thomas A Becket Church and are memorials to WWI and WWII. The gates were designed and erected by the Rev. Penfold in the early 1950s. They are wrought iron with the dates of the two world wars picked out in gold leaf paint.



### Memorial Shields, St. Thomas A Becketts Church, Westerleigh Road, Pucklechurch, BS16 9RB

Grid reference **ST 69924 76531** 

Located on the south wall inside the church there are two brass shields, one erected after WWI and the other after WWII. Although erected separately, the shields have been joined together.



# Rangeworthy

Holy Trinity Church, Church Lane, Rangeworthy, BS37 7ND Grid reference ST 68657 86244

Two memorial plaques are located above the doorway in the village church. There is also a third memorial mounted on the wall in the church.





# Rockhampton

St. Oswald's Church, Church Road, Rockhampton, GL13 9DX Grid reference ST 65481 93283

This memorial commemorates both WWI and WWII. It stands on the right of the pathway leading to the south porch of the church.





# Staple Hill

#### Page Park, Broad Street, Staple Hill, BS16 5LU

Grid reference **ST 65422 75921** 

This is a memorial in the form of a stone needle with a stepped base commemorating local people who died in WWI and WWII.





### Stoke Gifford

#### North Road, Stoke Gifford, BS34 8PD

Grid reference **ST 62275 79801** 

This is a stone war memorial located at North Road.







# Thornbury

#### St. Mary's Church, Castle Street, Thornbury, BS35 1HQ

Grid reference **ST 63399 90601** 

There is a stone war memorial located in the churchyard. There is also a memorial plaque mounted on the wall within the church.





### Castle School Sixth Form Annexe, Gloucester Road, Thornbury, BS35 1DJ

Grid reference **ST 63966 90432** 

There is a war memorial plaque located in the quadrangle at the old Thornbury Grammar Site that is now the sixth form annexe of Castle School. It lists the names of fallen former pupils of the Grammar School.






### **Tormarton**

#### St Mary Magdalene Church, Church Road, Tormarton, GL9 1HT

Grid reference **ST 76902 78837** 

This war memorial is in the form of a stone cross and is located within the churchyard.





### **Tortworth**

#### St Leonard's Church, The Lane, Tortworth, GL12 8HF

Grid reference ST 70431 93335

Mounted on the wall inside the church there are two plaques commemorating WWI. One is a 'Roll of Honour' and lists 39 names. The other is 'In Memory' and lists 11 names. There is also an old simple wooden cross from the battlefield mounted on the wall.





# **Tytherington**

St. James's Church, Stowell Hill Road, Tytherington, GL12 8UH Grid reference ST 66852 88332

This war memorial is in the form of a Celtic cross. It contains the names of those who lost their lives in both WWI and WWII.





# **Upton Cheyney**

Unitarian Church, Wick Lane, Upton Cheyney, Bitton, BS30 6NL *Grid reference ST* 69298 70122

This memorial plaque is attached to the external wall of the church. It list the names of those who lost their lives in WWI.





# **Upton Cheyney**

### War Memorial Shelter, Marshfield Lane, Upton Cheyney, Bitton, BS30 6ND

Grid reference **ST 69262 69894** 

This war memorial is in the form of a plaque mounted on the back wall of a memorial shelter.





# Wapley

#### St. Peter's Church, Wapley Hill, Wapley, BS37 8RJ

Grid reference **ST 71374 79717** 

This war memorial was erected after WWI and is constructed of a grey granite-like stone. The inscription states that it is 'erected to the memory of the fallen of this parish in the Great War 1914-1919'. The year 1919 represents the signing of the Peace Treaty of Versailles on 28th June of that year.





# Warmley

### Warmley War Memorial Gardens, Stanley Road/ High Street, Warmley, BS15 4ND

Grid reference **ST 66850 73598** 

This war memorial commemorates both WWI and WWII. On 19th January 1919 Siston Parish Council resolved to erect "A memorial to the boys of the parish slain in the war" and Warmley Green was chosen as the site.

The service for unveiling the memorial took place on Saturday 14th August 1920. Lady Goldney performed the unveiling ceremony and the service was completed by a dedication and address from the Archdeacon of Bristol. At the same time the park was declared open as a living memorial to the men who lost their lives. Warmley was allocated a German field gun, to be positioned in front of the memorial but at the beginning of WWII it was taken away to be melted down for the war effort.





#### Community Centre, Deanery Road, Warmley, BS16 9JB

This war memorial plaque is mounted on the wall within the community centre.



# Westerleigh

#### Village Green, Westerleigh Road, Westerleigh, BS37 8QH

Grid reference **ST 69981 79724** 

This war memorial is in the form of a stone Celtic cross located on the village green next to the church. The inscription reads 'The blood of heroes is the seed of freedom'.





#### Wick

#### Wick Chapel, High Street, Wick, BS30 5QH

Grid reference **ST 70709 72647** 

This war memorial commemorates both WWI and WWII. It is located outside of the chapel.



### Wickwar

#### Holy Trinity Church, Station Road, Wickwar, GL12 8NB

Grid reference **ST 72348 88897** 

This memorial is located within the church yard of the village church.

Colonel Burges of Ridge House and the Rector of St. Mary's Church, James Madden Ford unveiled St. Mary's memorial lych gate on 2nd January 1921 in memory of those who fought and died during WWI. The names of those who fought and died in WWII were added later.

### Parnall War Memorial, St. Mary's Church, Church Road, Yate, BS37 5BG Grid reference ST 71332 82816

This is a memorial to those killed in aerial attacks on the Parnall aircraft factory in Yate in February and March 1941. It is a rare example as it is dedicated to civilians rather than service personnel. The memorial was unveiled in February 1950.

Originally located within Chipping Sodbury Cottage Hospital, this memorial plaque is currently stored at the offices of Yate Town Council.
